Karl retired from McMaster University in 1992. As an Associate Professor in Social Work, Karl Kinanen taught the first Gerontology course in the mid-1970s and created the first Summer Institute on Gerontology in 1980. His work was instrumental in developing social gerontology at McMaster, and in Canada, and marked the beginning of many continuing education events for the professional community.
